SESE	<p>Science Can you think of some animals that lay eggs? Examples include: hens, ladybirds, frogs, birds.</p> <p>Attached on Seesaw is a short video. You can guess which one hatches from an egg and which don't before the picture appears!</p> <p>If you look at page 57 of Small World, you will see 6 pictures of animals some of which do lay eggs. You should only colour the animals that lay eggs. First up we can see the crocodile. The female crocodile lays her eggs on the ground and then buries them to protect</p>	<p>Science Today we are going to talk about our sense of smell. Attached on Seesaw is a short video clip. You breathe through your nostrils, the two openings at the end of your nose. The nose sends messages to your brain and the brain tells you what you smell. Some smells, like smoke from a fire, protect you by alerting you to danger. Other toxic things, poisons or rotten food smell so bad that you will not be tempted to eat or drink them. Have a little chat with mum or dad about</p>		<p>Geography So we all know that we are now in the season of summer. We have been talking about going to the beach over the last two weeks. Can you think of some items that you would only find at a beach? What would you wear to the beach? What would you bring with you to the beach? What kind of things should you not bring to the beach?</p> <p>This is very exciting girls!!! We are on the LAST page of Small World :) Hurray!! You will see on this page that there are 4 rows of pictures. Talk through the pictures</p>	

	<p>them from other animals that like to eat them. Baby crocodiles inside the eggs make sounds to call their mother. When the mummy crocodile hears the sounds of the crocodiles, she digs up the eggs to help them hatch. Then she takes the baby crocodiles to the water. The baby crocodiles mostly eat insects.</p> <p>Beside the crocodile you will see a snake. Most types of snake lay eggs. Their shells are soft. The parents do not stay with the eggs. The babies are left on their own to hatch and look for food.</p> <p>Under the snake you can see the turtle. Some types of turtles lay eggs in the sand on the beach and leave them to hatch on their own. The young turtle burrow out of the sand and scramble to the water while trying to avoid being eaten by sea birds!</p> <p>Lastly we have the swan. The male and female swans build a big nest</p>	<p>smells you like and smells you don't like!</p> <p>The sense of taste and smell are connected - if you have a stuffy nose your food will taste different because you can't smell it.</p> <p>Open up to p59 of Small World. At the top of the page you will see a couple of pictures. You should circle the smells that you like to smell. Underneath these there is a rectangular box where you need to draw at least 2 more things that you like to smell - that aren't on the page already!</p> <p>If you wish, there is an episode from "Come Outside" called Sewage linked on Seesaw.</p>		<p>with mum or dad. Only colour the things that you would bring to the beach with you. Remember to do your very best colouring on your very last page!</p> <p>Upload to the class journal page if you wish!</p>
